

## Chapter 15.08 BUILDING NUMBERING SYSTEM

Violation--Penalty.

15.08.005 Citywide addressing system. A. The city shall adopt as the official address system for all incorporated portions of the city the grid system as devised and implemented by the Scappoose rural fire protection district and Scappoose postal service and Columbia County.

B. The Scappoose rural fire protection district shall have sole responsibility for the initial implementation of the address system, and shall provide city with all information necessary to allow city to continue with the official address system in all new developments and houses. (Ord. 437 §§1, 2, 1982)

15.08.010 Numbering required. All residences and other places of occupancy within the city shall be numbered by the city recorder-treasurer, in accordance with numbering system established by the city council. (Ord. 237 §1, 1961)

15.08.020 Display of number. All residents, occupants, or owners shall affix the number assigned by the city recorder-treasurer and council to the exterior of said residence or place of occupancy in a place readily visible to the public. (Ord. 237 §2, 1961)

15.08.030 Specifications for displayed numbers. All numbers used in displaying the assigned number shall be in accordance with specifications established by the city council. A list of such specifications shall be made in the office of the city recorder-treasurer and shall be established by the city council by motion. (Ord. 237 §3, 1961)

15.08.040 Violation--Penalty. Any resident, occupant, or owner failing to affix an approved number in accordance with the terms of this chapter within thirty days after being notified by an authorized official of the city to affix such number, shall be deemed to be in violation of this chapter and shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars or more than two hundred fifty dollars.
